

Seed collecting at Winifred Curtis Reserve with Ruth Mollison

Seymour Community Action Group members were thrilled to participate in a seed collection workshop in December with Ruth Mollison from the Understory Network and Island Seeds Tasmania. The Winifred Curtis reserve was the perfect location for participants to learn how to identify tree and plant seeds ready for collection and harvesting techniques. Ruth will continue to work with SCAGI members in 2023 to demonstrate seed propagation techniques. These workshops are proudly supported by Landcare Tasmania.

SCAGI work tirelessly to eradicate gorse infestation and to restore native flora to preserve and maintain the unique environment of the Seymour wetlands. In June 2022 the Seymour Wetlands were reclassified as the Seymour Conservation Area which now occupies 115 hectares. SCAGI works closely with Tasmanian Parks Wildlife Services, Todd Dudley from the NE Bioregional Network and Landcare.
