PMAT General Meeting

Special Resolution to amend the Constitution Thursday 16 February 2023, 4.00 pm Mathers House, Hobart

Dear Alliance Members,

The Planning Matters Alliance Tasmania would like to invite all alliance member groups to a General Meeting to consider a special resolution for an important change to the PMAT Constitution.

The proposed change to Clause 6(b) - Obligations (iii) in the PMAT

Constitution will limit the liability of Alliance Member groups and bring the Constitution in line with standard indemnity clauses relevant for Incorporated Associations.

The change is based on legal advice and is being dealt with now, rather than waiting until the AGM later in the year, to ensure PMAT members are better protected. A paper outlining the proposed change is attached here.

As per the PMAT Constitution, a General Meeting requires a quorum of twelve (12) Member Groups. Note that each Member Group is entitled to one (1) vote only.
