






HISTORY

SEYMOUR SWAMP WAS THE SITE OF THE CLAY QUARRY FOR THE KILN ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE POINT.

THREE ATTEMPTS AT CONSTRUCTING WHARFS WERE ALL TAKEN BY THE SEA, WITH SHIPWRECKS AND LOSS OF LIFE.

A SAND BLOW FORMED ACROSS THE POINT DUE TO DISTURBANCE CAUSED BY FIRE AND GRAZING AND AN ATTEMPT AT RUTILE MINING



IN THE MID 1980'S

THE SEYMOUR COMMUNITY ACTION GROUP WAS FORMED

Parks and Wildlife assisted with establishing the carpark and signage for the protection of the Green and Gold frog.

EARLY WINS

STABILISING THE SAND BLOW.

TRAPPING FERAL CATS THAT WERE THREATENING NATIVE BIRDS AND OTHER WILDLIFE.

EXTENSIVE TREE PLANTING ON THE POINT.

The group has continued as a loose association of concerned residents and landowners.

Attempts to drain the swampland in 1990 for further subdivisions were stopped and community input for a new Development Plan was sought by Council.

IN 2002

Michelle Mentz and Peiter Van Der Woude formed a group to work in west Seymour undertaking weed management and replanting around the Seymour Wetlands. Private land surrounding the Seymour Wetlands was classified as Land for Wildlife.

IN 2015

EFFORTS TO DEAL WITH GORSE RESTARTED

It grew to 4.5 m high covering 16 ha.

The Tasmania Fire Service carried out a fuel reduction burn in 2016.





IN 2016

THE SEYMOUR COMMUNITY ACTION GROUP (SCAGI) WAS INCORPORATED


PRIMARILY TO DEAL WITH THE GORSE INFESTATION IN THE WETLANDS.
