1. Amendments made to the present VPP at request of Donna Stanley PWS Northern regional Manager.

Arising from this is the need to present the RJA to all participants in working bees.

Amend fortnightly working bees to regular working bees.

Have laminated MSDS available for all herbicides used available at working bees.

Organise work shop for propagation of locally collected native seeds. Contact with Understory Network and explore possibilities. http://www.understorey-network.org.au/index.html

To be included in WMP vol 2:

<u>Yearly goals</u>; ie. Spray all remaining gorse, slash open area, cut and paste gorse in native regenerated area, continue planting out open areas, mosaic burns of residual areas of heavy gorse regrowth, annual monitor of 3 separate transects to gauge diversity of regeneration. (Picnic area, NW corner, edge of swamp), an 'on ground' Aboriginal Heritage Survey to be conducted.

<u>5 year strategic plan</u>; ie. Walking track through area, bird hide, board walk around wetland, beach track up grade, boom gate to restrict beach access, eradicate feral dear from the area, plant trees along Champ Street, group acquisition of tractor/slasher/spray unit.

<u>Long term goals</u>; Eradication of gorse and complete native revegetation of the area, development of a community hub/fire station/centre in SW corner.

Hi Pete and Evie,

Thanks for taking the time to talk with me yesterday and for the good advice. I took it and enjoyed a surf.

It is a bit overwhelming here at present with a lot of gorse growing back and not being able to do much about it. It is too wet to get out there with spray gear and seems increasingly difficult to get people to cut and paste.

I am struggling on how to relate with the PWS who are requesting more bureaucratic documents from us and seemingly offering little on ground assistance.

Fiona Evert the PWS Ranger allocated to the Wetland Project inspected the Conservation Area last week and matters arising from the meeting are outlined in the forwarded email below.

There is a request from Donna Stanley, PWS Northern Manager, to complete the VPP and do another Weed Management Plan by the 1st December. (see drafts attached which Dani has been working on with Fee from PWS note the attached WMP was not accepted and Vol 2 is required).

Things we discussed Pete that you asked me to email you:

- 1. Evie mentioned SCAGI emails had not been received recently, or had been but were not easily found. I sent an email requesting Landcare post the recent working bee a couple of weeks ago and got no reply or action. I understand you are understaffed with people off work and this may of contributed to the oversight but there also maybe a glitch in the email system.
- 2. One of our group, Paul Williams from the Wobbly Boat Vineyard, has offered to grow native seedlings from locally collected seeds and I rang to enquire as to who was best to facilitate a work shop.

He is available on the weekends October 22/23 or November 12/13. Pete you mentioned you maybe able to assist with this.

3. Weed Spraying contractor from GSBC suggested a cold burn in some of the areas where there is still heavy infestation of juvenile gorse which was slashed prior to the big wet.

It is now too wet to get on to boom or spot spray which was the plan. When I brought it up with PWS I was informed it needed a PWS Burn Plan from a separate Department and may not happen for a few months. By then it will have grown and turned into a lot larger and more difficult burn to manage.

I have discussed cultural burning with Adrian Lowery from Preminghana at Marrawah. They have had great success with gorse control there using fire, and spraying.

It seems that burning is a good tool to use in gorse eradication and I'm not sure how we can access it?

- 4. PWS also require one of us to have Chemical Handling Cert to use chemicals for spraying and cutting and pasting. I have researched Tas TAFE 2 day course and an Online Chem Cert Course.

 Do you know of any cheap options and which would you recommend?
- 5. We need to have an AGM and I thought the weekend of October 22/23 (Kez and Melissa will not be here then) or November 12/13 maybe a good time to combine it with a plant propagation work shop.

It would be good to get personal from PWS, Landcare, NE Bioregional Network and SCAGI together to discuss the future management of the newly declared Conservation Area and if there is a role for SCAGI.

Any suggestions you have on how best to move forward with this Project will be greatly appreciated.
